The walk begins at the far end of the ICNA parking lot, at the head of the paved trail (by the NO DOGS sign)

1. Redbud	<i>Cercis canadensis</i>
<i>(just past the redbuds, turn right onto the dirt path)</i>	
2. Black Walnut	<i>Juglans nigra</i>
3. Black Cherry	<i>Prunus serotina</i>
<i>(where the path ends at the Paved Trail, turn left onto the trail)</i>	
4. Mockernut Hickory	<i>Carya tomentosa</i>
5. American Hornbeam	<i>Carpinus caroliniana</i>
6. White Oak	<i>Quercus alba</i>
<i>(near the hayrake)</i>	
7. Hackberry	<i>Celtis occidentalis</i>
8. Pawpaw	<i>Asimina triloba</i>
<i>(in about 15 yards turn onto an unmarked dirt path)</i>	
9. Northern Red Oak	<i>Quercus rubra</i>
<i>(where path ends, turn left onto the School Trail)</i>	
10. Spicebush	<i>Lindera benzoin</i>
11. American Beech	<i>Fagus grandifolia</i>
12. Black Gum or Black Tupelo	<i>Nyssa sylvatica</i>
13. Witch Hazel	<i>Hamamelis virginiana</i>
14. Eastern Red Cedar	<i>Juniperus virginiana</i>
<i>(cross over the bridge)</i>	
15. Downy Serviceberry	<i>Amelanchier arborea</i>
16. Cherry (Sweet, Black) Birch	<i>Betula lenta</i>
17. Tulip Poplar or Tuliptree	<i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i>
<i>(at the bench built by Eagle Scout Brad Nissen)</i>	
18. White Oak	<i>Quercus alba</i>
19. White Pine	<i>Pinus strobus</i>
20. Red Maple	<i>Acer rubum</i>
21. Southern Red or Spanish Oak	<i>Quercus falcata</i>
22. Scarlet Oak	<i>Quercus coccinea</i>
<i>(when the School Trail ends, turn left onto the Red Trail)</i>	
23. Black Cherry	<i>Prunus serotina</i>
24. Flowering Dogwood	<i>Cornus florida</i>
25. Southern Red or Spanish Oak	<i>Quercus falcata</i>
26. Eastern Red Cedar	<i>Juniperus virginiana</i>
27. Tulip Poplar or Tuliptree	<i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i>
28. Common Persimmon	<i>Diospyros virginiana</i>
